Of course there are Irish, Scandinavian, Scottish and English influences on the Manx music, but the traditional Manx tunes have a uniqueness about them that is intriguing and challenging for the accompanist. Fortunately the book has excellent chords and bowing suggestions, and many tunes are written out with very nice two and three part harmonies. With a bit of effort, our fiddlers

may play some of these for you sometime. Our practices for the fall are scheduled for Sept 2, 16 and 30, October 14 and 28, and November 11 and 25. We gather from 6:30 pm in the Rural Development Active Communities Building on Brooke and Main in Montague and play together from 7 to 9 pm. Entrance is through the side door on Brooke Street and we are upstairs to the left. Everyone is welcome to attend just to listen or to play along. Hope to see you there some evening!


